Master Painters® New Zealand, in partnership with Resene are once again pleased to facilitate the Master Painters Regional Apprentice of the Year competition. The winners in each of the 4 regional competitions will then compete at the Master Painters® New Zealand Annual Conference, with one being awarded:

“Master Painters Apprentice of the Year”

What is the Apprentice of the Year about?

The Master Painters Apprentice of the Year, in association with Resene, recognises excellence in the specialised trade of Painting and Decorating. The award raises awareness, not only within the Painting and Decorating fraternity, but also customers, and the public. This competition will find the most well-rounded apprentice, taking into account and testing for many skills.

What's in it for Me?

An opportunity to show off your trade skills as a future trades person and celebrate this with others in your year.

- Each candidate needs to submit two projects that they have either controlled or done the majority of the work on
- This must be endorsed by their employer
- These projects will then be assessed by a representative from MPA, and if possible, by a Resene rep in that region
- If you are chosen as the winner of your region, you will automatically be through to the finals where the winners from each region will compete for the overall title
- The entrant's partner, and 2 support people, will be invited to attend the Master Painters Conference, (sponsored by Resene), where the overall winner of the Apprentice of the Year will be announced
- Your Conference Package will include travel and accommodation costs for yourself and your 3 chosen support people, all courtesy of Resene
- Other guests such as employers, family etc., will be welcome to purchase tickets to the events, at their expense, to support the entrant.

Who is Eligible to Enter?

Full terms and conditions are on the last page of this application.
It is important you read them.

- The competition is open to apprentices who are in their third year that have or are completing their Apprenticeships in that year they apply for the competition.
- There is no age restriction
- Each entrant must have a supporting endorsement from their employer
- May need to have a current passport should the Conference be held offshore
- There are no restrictions on who the Apprentice is employed by - your employee need not be a member of Master Painters New Zealand

The regions are:

There are four regions, with the boundaries being:

1. **Northern Region** - Taupo and above, including Gisborne.
2. **Lower North Island** - the rest of the North Island
3. **Upper South Island** - above the Waitaki River
4. **Lower South Island** - below the Waitaki River, including Central Otago

How to Enter

Complete the Application form and submit it, no later than 5pm, on the 31st March 2023.

(If posted, it must be received by this date, email entries will not be accepted after this time)

What Information do we need from you?

- Apprentices contact details - This section is so you can tell us who you are and how we can contact you
- Employer Information - We will need the contact details of your current employer, so we can talk with them. If you are now self-employed ask your previous employer if they can be contacted by us
- Apprenticeship Information - We will need to know the name and contact details of your BCITO Training Advisor
- Have You Got What It Takes - Tell us why you believe you are worthy of being the Regional Painting and Decorating Apprentice of the Year (200-300 words)
- Portfolio Details - This is the exciting part, where you get to showcase project(s) that you are currently working on, or have completed, while in training. You can use your creativity to present this information, for example photos, video or any fantastic presentation method using online technology if you wish. Don't forget we will need you to inform us about the project(s) ~ what your involvement was, the skills you used, challenges you faced and how you solved any problems
- Permission for the assessors to view the projects is also required
- Declaration - Don't forget to sign your application - this means you're letting us know that what you've submitted is a true and accurate account of your involvement in any projects in your portfolio

Stages of Judging and Important Dates

Note: You will be notified of your success, or otherwise, as each stage progresses.

1.Entries open (Note: you can prepare your application earlier) – All year
2.Entries close – portfolios must be submitted no later than 5pm – 31 March 2023
3.Onsite assessments completed by - TBA
4.Regional winner, partner and 2 support people will attend the Master Painters Conference held in September each year
